



Introduction: In this series on loving our neighbors, we have already focused on...

- (1) The 5 Love your Neighbor Laws Leviticus 19
- (2) Who is your neighbor? (Good Samaritan Luke 10) Anyone with a need.
- (3) What if your neighbor is your enemy? (Matthew 5)
